Advertisement; 1 item
Undated. Advertisement for E. Underhill's Son, Brewer of ales, porters and stout, Yonkers, New York; Underhill coat of arms on card. [See UG 6:1440]
- D-0227 COCK, REESE
Register book; 1 item, 46 pages
Undated. Hand-bound book with soft cover in which Reese Cock, of North Castle, recorded names of Quakers who made religious visits to America from 1656, and later those who made visits to other meetings anywhere; also list of visitors to Chappaqua Meeting ca. 1828-29; at least two different handwritings.
- D-0229 UNDERHILL, JAMES
Notebook; 1 item
13 February 1815. Notebook used by James Underhill (UG #1539) in studying bills of exchange, different currencies. Written on inside: "James Underhills Book, White Plains, Febr 13, 1815."
- D-0240 UNDERHILL, JOHN
Land record; 1 item
25 January 1713/14. A true copy of a town record of land laid out to John Underhill (UG #10); record signed by George Townsend; a part of the land laid out was bought from Henry Cock.
- D-0241 UNDERHILL, JOHN
[oversized doc. box] Deed; 1 item
20 February 1667. Hand written copy of a deed from Indian proprietors of Matinecock to John Underhill (UG #1 or 4) for 50 acres of land near Corn Creek, Matinecock (now Lattingtown). [Note by Julia Clark: the ledger describes this as a deed of sale, but also states it is a copy of D-0242; it is a copy, not an executed deed.] Deed witnessed by Robert Williams, Matha [Matthew or Martha?] Prior, and Henry Reddocke. No Indian signatures were written on this copy.

[oversized] Indian Deed; 1 item
26 March 1685. Suscaneman, Samous and Quarapin, Indian proprietors of Matinecock, seel to John Rogers a tract of land at the little plains of Matinecock, said land laid out by Thomas Townsend and Nathaniel Coles, bounded by the land of John Underhill (UG #4) on the north; witnessed by Thomas Townsend, and Henry Townsend, Jr. [Note by Julia Clark: Ledger describes this as "Deed signed by Indians John Underhill b. 1642," but it is Indian deed to John Rogers.] On reverse side of deed, 8 October 1685, John Rogers assigned this land to John Underhill (UG #4), witnessed by Thomas Townsend and George Townsend.
- D-0243 PRATT, JOHN
[oversized] Deed; 1 item
24 March 1702/3. John Pratt of the Town of Oyster Bay sells to John Underhill (UG #10) a whole right in the new general purchase; witnessed by James Townsend, Gideon Wright, and John Townsend.
- D-0244 UNDERHILL, RICHARD
Quit rent; 1 item
24 March 1800. Richard Underhill (UG #557?) pays the arrears on quit rent due on land bounded by lands of Timothy Purdy and William Baker (no more specific location given). Arrears paid to the State of New York; signed by John V. Henry, Comptroller, and Robert McCallen, Treasurer.
- D-0246 UNDERHILL, ISRAEL
Family record; 1 item
1732-1842. Handwritten, on the reverse side of the title page of a New Testament, birth and death record of Israel Underhill (UG #108) and his wife Abigail Lisperard and their children Elizabeth (UG #339), Anthony L. (#340), Mary (#341), Frances (#342), Bartow (#343), Sarah (#345), Clary (#346). [missing is Paul (UG #344)]
- D-0249 BOGERT, H. H. AND DOLLY
Deed; 1 item
29 April 1824. Sale of land by Herman H. Bogert of Genever [*sic*], Ontario County, New York, and Dolly his wife, to Sarah M. Underhill and Abraham M. Underhill (UG #1084), Skanateless, Onondago County; described as a parcel of

land in the town of Hector, Thompkins County, subdivision #3, lot #6, 149 acres, more or less; witness, D. M. Lewis.

- D-0254 UNDERHILL, AARON T.
Marriage certificate; 1 item
16 July 1849. Aaron T. Underhill (UG #2786) and Lucinda C. Harris were married by S. H. Cobb on above date. They were the parents of David Harris Underhill (UG #4999).
- D-0255 SUTTON, A. J.
Poetry; 1 item
Undated. Sent by A. J. Sutton (UG #1035?) to Lydia Underhill (UG #1133) at New Castle; said to be a verse left in the Grotto at Bath by Mr. Sheridan.
- D-0256 UNDERHILL, MOSES
Will; 1 item
24 March 1812. A hand written copy of the last will and testament of Moses Underhill (UG #388) of Yorktown, Westchester County, N.Y.; mentions his wife Anna, son Abraham M. Underhill (UG #1084), daughters Sarah (#1083), Abigail (#1085), Mary (#1086), Ann (#1087), Hannah Jane (#1088); executors his brothers, Abraham I. (UG #381), Caleb (#383), and Jesse Mekeel; witnesses Isaac Mekeel (husband of UG #386), William Underhill (UG #1069), Josiah Underhill (UG #1070); also mentioned is Nine Partners boarding school.
- D-0284 UNDERHILL, RICHARD
Letter; 1 item
22 February 1788. From Richard Underhill (UG #557) to his "brother and sister" (probably to his brother James Underhill [UG #558] and his new wife Mary Titus); letter discusses leading a religious life.

Undated. Four pages of Ann Eliza Underhill (UG #), hand written on one folded piece of paper. From Estate of Hannah P. Underhill, fourth wife of Alfred (UG #1542).

6 November 1865. For payment of interest due on a bond and mortgage with the Liverpool and London and Globe Insurance Company, New York City; said to have been made out by Walter Underhill (UG #2787).

(UG #15443); also, marriage of Alfred Underhill (UG #1542) to Jane Underhill (UG #1018) daughter of Solomon (UG #373) and Phebe Underhill, and their children Caroline (UG #1542-A), Solomon (UG #1542-D), Phebe (UG #1542-E); marriage of Alfred Underhill to Hannah Maria Sutton (UG #) and their child Alfred S. 27 May 1904. Notes on the funeral of Hannah M. (Underhill) Isaac (UG #2789), by D. Harris Underhill (UG #4999). Gives account of her family, the family of her husband, her interests, who attended, and an account of the proceedings; filed with envelope that contained the notes.

D-0361-002b RELIGIOUS SOCIETY OF FRIENDS

Notebook; 1 item, 16 pages

1774-1798. Consists of 8 leaves (2 uncut), 6 being sewn together by hand, the other 2 detached, making 16 pages in all, two being blank. On the cover of one end of the notebook (a detached sheet) is written [in the hand of Josiah Quinby], "This Book Contains A Record of Friends Settlements Concerning Friends Meeting House and Lott at West Chester" and (in a different hand) "Sarah"; this is followed by 2-page examination and settlement of accounts, in the hand of Josiah Quinby (based on his reference to himself in text), pertaining to the shingling of the Friends' meeting house, with entries from 25 Nov. 1774 to 3 Apr. 1776, mentioning Stephanus Hunt, Josiah Quinby, John Ferris, Charles Doughty, Moses Quinby, and Daniel Quinby [Note: The Josiah Quinby who m. Amy Underhill (UG #264) may be too young to be the one here]; and a 2-page settlement, [in Josiah Quinby's hand], of his account with Stephanus Hunt, with entries from 3 Apr. 1776-to 30 June 1784, mentioning Moses Quinby, Daniel Quinby, Stephanus Hunt; and Benjamin Ferris. On the cover of the other end of the Notebook (entered upside down) is written "School Rules and Regulations are Entered in this Book 1788" along with "The Five Queries which are to be Answered The Last monthly Meeting before Every Quarterly Meeting Except the last Quarterly before the yearly When the Twenty Queries Is to be Answered"; this is followed by: a page containing "The Six Queries which are to be Answered In Our Preparative Meetings to go up to the Monthly Meetings before every Quarterly"; a page listing the schedule of quarterly meetings at Purchase and Oblong; a 5-page record of school committees, beginning with "At a general Meeting of the School Committee appointed by the Purchase Monthly Meeting and of Each Preparative Meeting held at Mamaroneck the 20th Day of the 11th Month in the Year 1788," and continuing with "The School Committees from

Each Preparative Meeting and also the Committee of the Monthly Meeting met again at Mamaroneck the 12th Day of the 12th Month 1788," to establish rules and regulations, and concluding with "Rules of Conduct for the Youth"; and a page listing "Children that I have taught deceas'd" (possibly in the hand of the "Sarah" who inscribed her name on the opposite cover—cf. the entry for the pupil "Sarah")—listing: for 1781, Aaron Quinby son of Moses Quinby, Charles Bowne, son of Matthew Bowne, John Buckbee, son of John Buckbee; for 1782, Ebenezer Drake, son of Underhill Bud Drake, Charles Underhill (UG #), son of Israel Underhill (UG #); for 1789, Mary Hunt, daughter of Peter Hunt; for 1790, Mary Hunt, daughter of Isaac Hunt; for 1791, Susannah Baxter, daughter of James Baxter, Hannah Conklin, daughter of Nathaniel Conklin, Elvin Hunt, son of Elvin Hunt; for 1792, Elijah Hunt, son of William Hunt; for 1793, Elizabeth Fergerson, daughter of Nehemiah Fergerson, Sarah Hunt, daughter of William Hunt; for 1794, Dorcas Quinby (UG #1142) and Phebe Quinby (UG #1141), daughters of James Quinby (husband of UG #396), Sophia Leggett, daughter of Joseph Leggett; for 1795, Elijah Honeywell, son of Enoch Honeywell, Elizabeth Quinby (UG #1140), daughter of James Quinby; for 1796, Mary Wood, daughter of Moses Quinby, Elizabeth Barns, daughter of Caleb Pell, William Glean, son of []; for 1798, Mary Baxter, daughter of [Oylesbee?] Drake, Haydock Hunt, son of Aaron Hunt, Jonathan Randall, son of Jonathan Randall, Joshua DeLapline, son of Joshua DeLapline.

13 April 1772. Haviland & Quinby have dissolved their co-partnership (began 1 June 1763) and settle their accounts; in the hand of and signed by Josiah Quinby.

D-0361-010 UNDERHILL, ELIZABETH C.

Address; 1 item

Undated. A small piece of paper on which is written "Elizabeth C. Underhill" (UG #1081) and her address "Chappaqua, West Chester County, New York."

D-0361-011 CHAPPAQUA MONTHLY MEETING

Dismissal; 1 item

12 November 1829. As Elizabeth Underhill (probably UG #1081), having not attended meeting, and having "attached herself to another meeting," Chappaqua M.M. considers her no longer a member; signed by David Carpenter and Phebe C. Underhill.

D-0361-012 SUTTON, S.

Letter; 1 item

18 March 1810. S. Sutton (UG #1030?), at Nine Partners, to her aunt, Hannah Quinby (UG #386), relating an assortment of events; mentions I. Thorne, Anna Merritt, Consider Merritt, Uncle Abraham (UG #381) and Aunt Rebecca, Silas, Phebe, sister Mary (UG #1034), brother Aaron (UG #1035), Henry Hull, Caleb Macomber, Anna Merritt, Little Nine Partners and Stanford.

D-0361-013 YEARLY MEETING OF WOMEN FRIENDS

Letter; 1 item

21 August 1815. Fragment of a letter from "our yearly meeting of women friends," held at Short Creek for areas of the State of Ohio, Indiana Territory, and adjacent parts of Pennsylvania and Virginia by adjournments from 21 August to "the _____ of the same inclusive 1815," to "the next yearly meeting of women friends to be held in New York" (first sheet containing two pages only).

D-0361-014 JOURNAL

1 item

ca. 1837. One page from a religious journal; gives details of meeting, Biblical quotes, etc. from September 1837 to July 1838; months written in Quaker style and a Yearly Meeting mentioned; writer is not identified, but was born 29 October 1799.

D-0361-016 UNDERHILL, JAMES Q.

Biblical quote; 1 item

27 July 1834. Hand written quote from the Bible from Genesis 45th chapter, verse 19 to the end of the chapter; signed by James Q. Underhill (UG #2784).

D-0361-017 QUINBY, S.

Funeral poem; 1 item

26 January 1822. A poem written on the death of S. Quinby; signed by "Anonymous"; part of the page is torn off.

D-0361-020 UNDERHILL, ELIZABETH C.

Journal; 2 pages

9 July 1835. "A long journal of a short journey" of Charles R. Underhill (UG #1132) and his wife Elizabeth C. Underhill"; accounts with James H. Crony, who was apparently a tailor.]

26 March 1806. "In Memory of Mrs. Mary Cock," wife of Thomas Cock, Sr. of Mill Neck, N.Y., who died from a dropsy in the stomach, by John R. Weeks; she was daughter of Thomas Smith of Hog Island (now Centre Island); Thomas Cock operated the mill at Mill Neck that had been Robert Feke's mill.
